Psalm 19

- 1 The heavens are telling the glory of God and the firmament proclaims his handiwork.
- 2 One day pours out its song to another and one night unfolds knowledge to another.
- 3 They have neither speech nor language and their voices are not heard,
- 4 Yet their sound has gone out into all lands and their words to the ends of the world.
- 5 In them has he set a tabernacle for the sun, that comes forth as a bridegroom out of his chamber

and rejoices as a champion to run his course.

- 6 It goes forth from the end of the heavens and runs to the very end again, and there is nothing hidden from its heat.
- 7 The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul; •

the testimony of the Lord is sure and gives wisdom to the simple.8 The statutes of the Lord are right and rejoice the heart; •

the commandment of the Lord is pure and gives light to the eyes.

9 The fear of the Lord is clean and endures for ever; •

the judgements of the Lord are true and righteous altogether.

- 10 More to be desired are they than gold, more than much fine gold, •sweeter also than honey, dripping from the honeycomb.
- 11 By them also is your servant taught and in keeping them there is great reward.
- 12 Who can tell how often they offend? O cleanse me from my secret faults!
- 13 Keep your servant also from presumptuous sins

lest they get dominion over me; • so shall I be undefiled, and innocent of great offence.

14 Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, •

O Lord, my strength and my redeemer.

Luke 4. 14-21

14 Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. ¹⁵He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone.

16 When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, ¹⁷and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written:

18 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,because he has anointed meto bring good news to the poor.He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives

and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free,

¹⁹ to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.'

²⁰And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. ²¹Then he began to say to them, 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.'
